

Lose Your Memory & Leave BankBeater DNA at Home

Most of us fish from "MEMORY" ... we either return to fish areas where we caught fish previously or return to a place where we observed someone else catch a fish. I remember the first time I caught a fish, I was at a pay lake with an old Zebco 202. I hooked a catfish and then took off running with the pole in hand and drug the fish up on the bank, didn't even know I was suppose to reel it in. I grabbed the wildly flopping fish and you know what happened ... the splines on the catfish stung me good. That's how I remember my first catch. I returned to the pay lake, many times after that, stood in the same spot and caught a fish or two. I can remember that spot like it was yesterday even though it was almost 60 years ago ... I remember! I emember!

Most of us anglers are born with BANKBEATER DNA too. I was no exception! My first experience fishing from a boat was on Nolin Lake for bass and casting to the bank was what we did. I was using a Zebco 33 and casting a white and black spotted Mud Bug when I caught my first bass. Enter BANKBEATER DNA. I fished banks for most of my life and sometimes I caught fish but it seemed like a lot of times I did not. Were did they go?

Sound familiar? Most of us do fish from Memory and have BANKBEATER DNA in us. Old habits are hard to break

In our Precision Sonar "On the Water" sonar class we ask that our clients invest a significant amount of time learning to be a better map-reader. The goal is for the client to learn to take a section of the lake, condense it to a manageable form and identify the areas of greatest potential. The areas we most focus on are roadbeds, creek channels, drainage ditches and bottom contours and any significant combination thereof. Most of these areas are OFFSHORE. Once we've chosen an area to investigate, we motor the

boat and scour the area with our Lowrance StructureScan looking for fish holding habitat whether it be a change in the bottom contour, cover or a combination of both.

In the first screen shot, the left side of the screen has a map of the lake showing an old road bed with submerged bridges crossing the creek channel. A couple of small bass were caught here before they got wise and shut down.

The second screen shot shows Bridge #2 with some well-placed brush piles. We caught a couple of crappie from the brush pile located on the bridge but they were too small to keep. The brush pile a few yards away from the bridge held better fish.

Learn to be a better map-reader and you'll find high percentage areas that are offshore and less pressured. The fish might be easier to catch too!

You'll learn how to identify which locations are waypoint worthy and how to go back to those locations without ever assigning a waypoint. You'll learn to only assign a waypoint once you are satisfied the location is worth saving.

- Demo the unit for you to help you be familiar with the screens and commands, so you'll have a good understanding of how to use the unit and take advantage of its fish finding capabilities.
- Provide you with back up material to keep you on track once the class is over

As a bonus you'll learn to read an electronic topo map and learn how to condense and area to a manageable level and identify those sweet spots that hold fish.
